

Noorani Qaida Learning Roadmap

A simple, step-by-step path from the Arabic alphabet to confident, correct Quran recitation — the same 5 stages our teachers use in one-on-one classes.

The 5 Stages of Noorani Qaida

Stage 1 — Recognizing the Letters	All 29 Arabic letters, learned by shape and sound in their standalone (isolated) form first. This is where fluency begins — most children spend 2–3 weeks here.
Stage 2 — Harakat (Vowel Marks)	Fatha, kasra and damma — the short marks above and below a letter that change how it sounds. This turns silent letters into readable syllables.
Stage 3 — Joining Letters	Letters change shape slightly when connected to form real words — the way they actually appear in the Quran, not in isolation.
Stage 4 — Tanween, Sukoon & Madd	Double vowel endings, stopping rules, and elongation (madd) — the rules that make recitation flow smoothly instead of sounding choppy.
Stage 5 — Tajweed Basics	Correct pronunciation (makhraj) of each letter and the foundational Tajweed rules that carry directly into full Quran reading.

How long does it take?

Most students complete all 5 stages in **8–12 weeks** with consistent short practice (15–20 minutes, 4–5 days a week) — faster with a teacher correcting mistakes in real time, since self-taught pronunciation errors are hard to un-learn later.

5 Tips for Parents Teaching at Home

- Keep sessions short and consistent — 15 minutes daily beats 2 hours once a week.
- Don't correct every mistake mid-sentence — let your child finish, then go back.
- Say the letter sound out loud yourself first, clearly, before asking your child to repeat it.
- Celebrate progress through each stage, not just the finish line — this keeps kids motivated.
- If pronunciation mistakes aren't improving after a few weeks, a teacher correcting them live is far more effective than more solo practice — wrong habits are hard to unlearn.
